Goals for 2022-2024

Behavioral Health

Goal – Increase counseling services for mental health issues for children and adolescents

Objectives:

- ⑩ **Work with community partners to plan how to increase the availability of mental health counseling services for children and adolescents**

Chronic Disease Management

Goal – Reduce risk factors, improve management of disease, reduce and burden, and improve the quality of life for area residents with chronic disease

Objectives:

- ⑩ **Increase enrollments in diabetes self-management education classes**
- ⑩ **Continue to offer Heritage Valley endocrinology services at various locations**
- ⑩ **Increase enrollment of persons at high risk for diabetes in prevention services (LifeSmart Program)**
- ⑩ **Increase enrollment in Medical Nutrition Counseling Services**
- ⑩ **Address improved quality of care through metrics established between physician offices and payors**
- ⑩ **Reduce hospital readmissions from chronic diseases**
- ⑩ **Conduct health screenings in higher risk communities**

Substance Use Disorder

Goal – Increase the capacity of inpatient and outpatient services and to provide programs to help those recovering from substance use disorder to stay healthy

Objectives:

- ⑩ **Work with community partners to plan how to increase the capacity of inpatient and outpatient services for those with substance use disorder**
- ⑩ **Work with community partners to develop a plan to provide programs or promote the use of existing programs to help those recovering from substance use disorder to stay healthy**

Process of Care

Goal – To better coordinate care for complex medical cases and to better coordinate care across the care continuum

Objectives:

- ⑩ **Continue to utilize health care navigators/case managers for complex medical cases**
- ⑩ **Evaluate, with community partners and payors, the feasibility of providing neighborhood health workers in areas with a higher disease burden**
