What is a **Radiographer**

Radiographers are health care professionals who use radiation (or X-rays) to create medical images of the body. Other names used for the profession are: Radiologic Technologist or X-ray Technologist. Radiographers are responsible for positioning patients regarding imaging and determining safe levels of radiation to administer and obtain images of high diagnostic quality.

Radiologic Technology Requirements

To successfully complete the Radiologic Technology major, the following coursework is required:

- 21 credits as listed under Science & Mathematics Courses
- 28 credits as listed under Health Science Courses
- 3 credits as listed under Additional Requirements
- 15 CORE credits
- A minimum of 67 credits are required for degree

Program Description

The Heritage Valley Health System/La Roche University Radiography Program is a two-year program composed of both academic study and clinical education of the art and science of medical radiographic imaging. Upon completion of the program, graduates are awarded an Associate in Health Science

Degree and a Certificate of completion in Radiologic Technology. Graduates are also eligible to apply to the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) for the nationally recognized credentialing examination. Those who pass the ARRT exam in radiography are awarded the "RT(R)" for "Registered Technologist" (radiography).

Admission Criteria and Guidelines

- You must be 18 years of age or older by October 1st of the first fall semester
- You must be a high school graduate or have a general equivalency diploma
- You must have had a minimum GPA of 2.5 in high school or within 12 credits from a post-secondary institution
- You must have received a minimum grade of C in Biology in high school or in a post-secondary institution

How to Apply

- 3. Once accepted by La Roche University, apply to Heritage Valley Health System School of Radiography
- 4. Interview with the School of Radiography
